## Y1 Update

In Writing this week, Y1 has been learning how to write a set of instructions. We understand that using our box plan can help us write our set of instructions. We also know that using command words, help us write- words like fold, get, make and cut.

This week in Maths, Y1 has been learning to read and write o'clock and half past in words. We know when the minute hand is on the '12' that means it is o'clock. Equally, when the minute hand is pointing towards the '6', we know the time is half past.

In History, we have been reflecting on our trip to Headstone Manor- A Muddled up Toy Chest. We were able to use our knowledge and skills of toys to help us write our end of term report: How have toys changed over time? We were able to describe our favourite toy from the past and it has changed over time.

This week in Science, we have been what happens to animals in winter. We know some animals hibernate, stay at home or are actually still active in the winter! We were able to categorise animals into those three groups. Finally, we chose two animals (Squirrels and Hedgehogs) and wrote a fact file on both of them!

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### Y2 Update

Year 2 had a fantastic week! In Writing we continued to write a recipe for the delicious Jam Sandwich from title to method, the children have written some very detailed recipes that any chef would easily follow.

In Maths we have looked at the relationship between multiplication and division. We drew part/whole models to show our thinking and to find the missing numbers in equations. It is pleasing to see the children's confidence in these two operations growing each day. Well done, Year 2! Please continue to practise 2s, 5, and 10s tables. We will be consolidating multiplications and divisions in the first week back.

Next term we begin our Maths with a unit on time. Please can parents revise: O'clock, half past, quarter past and quarter to, with your child so they are ready for the new learning in this unit.

In History we completed our learning about the famous 'Great Fire of London'. We rounded off the unit by looking at how the fire may have been avoided and wrote our ideas in a final essay.

In Science we looked at the alarmingly negative impact plastic has on our world. We looked into the terms: reduce, reuse and recycle. We brainstormed ideas of how we can try to change our lives to cut down on our use of single use plastics. The second lesson we completed was all about inventors of different materials.

### Y3 Update

Year 3 have enjoyed the last week of Autumn term and have been continuing to work extremely hard before the Christmas holidays!

In Reading, we have continued to read our class book, The Creakers by Tom Fletcher, and have looked at the different characters in the story. We have also summarised the chapters that we have read to explain the events to someone who might be interested in reading it.

In Writing, the children have published their sets of instructions independently in their portfolio books.

In Mathematics, we have continued to look at solving word problems and using our key mathematical vocabulary to interpret them. We have also looked at word problems that involve finding the difference as well as addition and subtraction.

In Science and History, we have looked at the importance of soil and the features of different types of soils, such as colour, structure, texture and moisture. In History, we have explored different civilizations across the world and compared them to the Stone, Bronze, and Iron Ages.

On Wednesday, Year 3 and the whole school were able to visit St Andrew's Church to watch the school choir perform and sing Christmas songs and carols that they have been practising throughout the week. Year 3 really enjoyed this experience and have been enjoying the festive celebrations taking place at school. Thank you to all of the parents who were able to join us at the church - it was great to see your support!

### Y4 Update

Year 4 has sped through this last week of term and had lots of fun! For our special Christmas events, all children in school visited St. Andrew's Church on Wednesday and joined in on singing Christmas songs and carols. Lots of children in Year 4 were also in the choir, and enjoyed performing to the whole school. They even learned a few fun facts about Christmas, such as where the word 'carol' comes from! Following this on Thursday, KS2 were visited by Harrow Music service. They saw a few familiar faces in the form of their violin teachers, and heard a lovely concert played by the adults.

In Reading, the children learned new vocabulary from an extract and applied these to sentences. We also focused on comprehension and retrieval of information from the text. In Writing, the children have completed their independent task of writing a persuasive letter to the Mayor of London. In Maths, we started a new topic on Fractions, and the children learned about 'quantities of' a whole.

In History, the children have been working hard on their end of unit essay, concluding the topic on Roman Britain. Pupils wrote about the impact that the Roman invasion had on Britain, and how this continues to affect us to this day. In Science, we finished the States of Matter unit by looking at the water cycle, and how states of matter change throughout the cycle itself.

Please find all knowledge organisers for next term on Google Classroom, and additional Mathletics tasks set. Please also continue to encourage children to access TTRS over the break and to continue reading for at least 15 minutes each day.

### **Y5 Update**

Year 5 had a busy last week of term! We took a break from our novel to read an extract from Roald Dahl's Matilda which the children loved. We looked at Matilda's first day at school reciting her timetables and hearing about the infamous Miss Trunchbull. Children explored vocabulary in the text as well as answering comprehension questions and summarising the extract. They watched a short clip from the film to compare the text and the movie.

In Maths, children continued looking at fractions and how these can be converted into decimal numbers through equivalent fractions to 10, 100 and 1000. They will continue to recap this during the first week back after the holidays before moving on to our next topic, drawing and reading angles. In Writing, children have been working hard on their end of unit essays for their History topic, Vikings and Anglo-Saxons, planning and writing everything they have learnt this half-term. Finally, in Science, children ended their topic by experimenting with water resistance using tubs of water and objects to explore the terms 'buoyancy' and 'upthrust' as well as learning about streamlined shapes.

Children loved the snow, and to continue the Christmas spirit, children enjoyed walking to the church on Wednesday afternoon. Our Year 5's were responsible for walking with the Year 1 pupils and they did a fantastic job of being role models, well done! We sang carols in the Church and listened to the nativity story. Many of our pupils were also involved in the choir, showing off their wonderful singing skills.

For next term, we have uploaded knowledge organisers and spellings for next half-term on the Google classroom as well as handing out a hard copy to children to take home. We have assigned Mathletics tasks, please could children continue to complete these as well as TTRS and do some Accelerated Reader quizzes online.

### Y6 Update

Year 6 have thoroughly enjoyed the last week of Autumn term before the Christmas break.

In Reading this week, we have continued 'Eye of the Wolf'. We have moved forward in the story and have discovered how our main character, 'Blue Wolf', had gotten split up from his pack and how he sacrificed himself to save his sister, 'Shiny Straw'. We have focused on the Reading Domain, 'Translator', through focusing on unpicking and analysing key vocabulary found in the text. In Maths, we have looked at finding missing angles in both triangles and quadrilaterals.

In Writing this week, we have edited and published our independent formal letters of complaint. The children have really improved their self and peer editing skills and this has shown in the fantastic work they have produced in their Writing portfolio books that the children can look back on and celebrate as the year goes on.

In Geography, we have continued our topic, 'Global Challenges'. This week we have looked at climate change and how global warming is having a negative impact on our planet. In Science we have studied microorganisms. We have discovered that some microorganisms are actually helpful, such as algae, which provides 75% of the Earth's oxygen! However, some microorganisms are very dangerous, such as viruses, which can lead to deadly diseases.

On Wednesday, all of Year 6 headed to St Andrew's Church, where we all took part in carol singing along with the whole school. All of Year 6 did a tremendous job assisting our Reception children walking to and from the church. Well done to Kanthavi in 6 Edinburgh whose decorative front cover for the service was chosen for the booklets for the whole school.

On Thursday, Year 6 took part in a Transport for London (TFL) workshop. This workshop was very informative and provided the children with lots of necessary information and guidance on how to safely use public transport as they prepare for Year 7 and beyond.

Also on Thursday, we were treated by a fantastic music concert from the Harrow Music Service. We were treated to some fantastic pieces of music with a variety of different instruments and the children thoroughly enjoyed the show!



# School admissions

Applications are now open for Nursery and Reception school places for September 2023. Due to high demand, places at Roxbourne Primary School fill very quickly. Should you have family, friends or neighbours with Nursery or Reception aged children, please let them know that applications are now open as detailed below.

## Open Days

We are running a series of Open mornings to allow prospective parents to visit the school during a teaching day, meet with our Head Teacher Mr Benserghin and ask any questions they may have. If any of your family, friends or neighbours, who are interested in applying to Roxbourne for a place for their child, would like to attend one of our Open Mornings, please ask them to register on our Open Morning booking <u>form</u>.

## **Nursery Admissions**

Choosing the right nursery for your child can be difficult. **Roxbourne Nursery** provides high quality early years education, giving priority to the developmental needs and happiness of our children and their families in a safe environment where the wellbeing of every child is our utmost concern. Our teachers and support staff are passionate in their role of working with children and provide the necessary skills and knowledge to enhance the child's learning and development. As part of this process we recognise and value the diverse community that we are part of, believing that quality can be achieved by working together in partnership with parents and other service providers. We would love you to visit our beautiful homely environment to see how settled and happy the children are.







All three and four year olds are entitled to 15 hours per week of early year's education each academic year from the start of the term after their third birthday, up until the term after their fifth birthday. This is known as the *universal entitlement*.

Three and four year olds, whose parents meet the criteria, will be eligible for an additional 15 hours per week. This is known as the *extended entitlement*. Eligibility guidelines for free full-time nursery can be found at <a href="https://www.gov.uk/30-hours-free-childcare">https://www.gov.uk/30-hours-free-childcare</a>. If you are not eligible but would still be interested in a full-time place, please contact the school office on 020 8422 9207.

We offer three nursery sessions: morning only, afternoon only and full-time.

### **Nursery Admissions (Starting in September 2023)**

Applications are now open for nursery school places for September 2023, if your child was born between 1 September 2019 and 31 August 2020.

You must apply through the Harrow Council nursery school place website.
