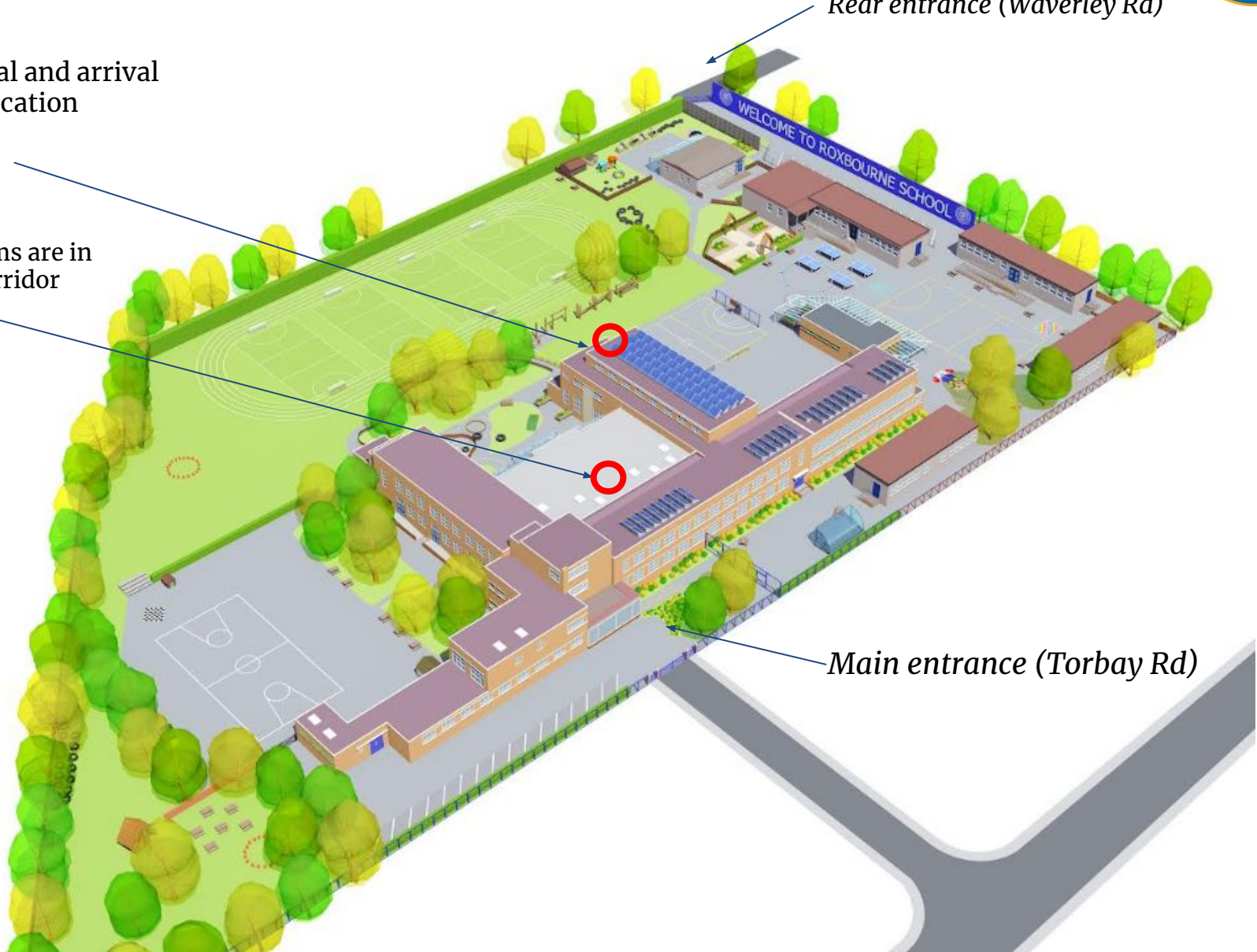


Dismissal and arrival

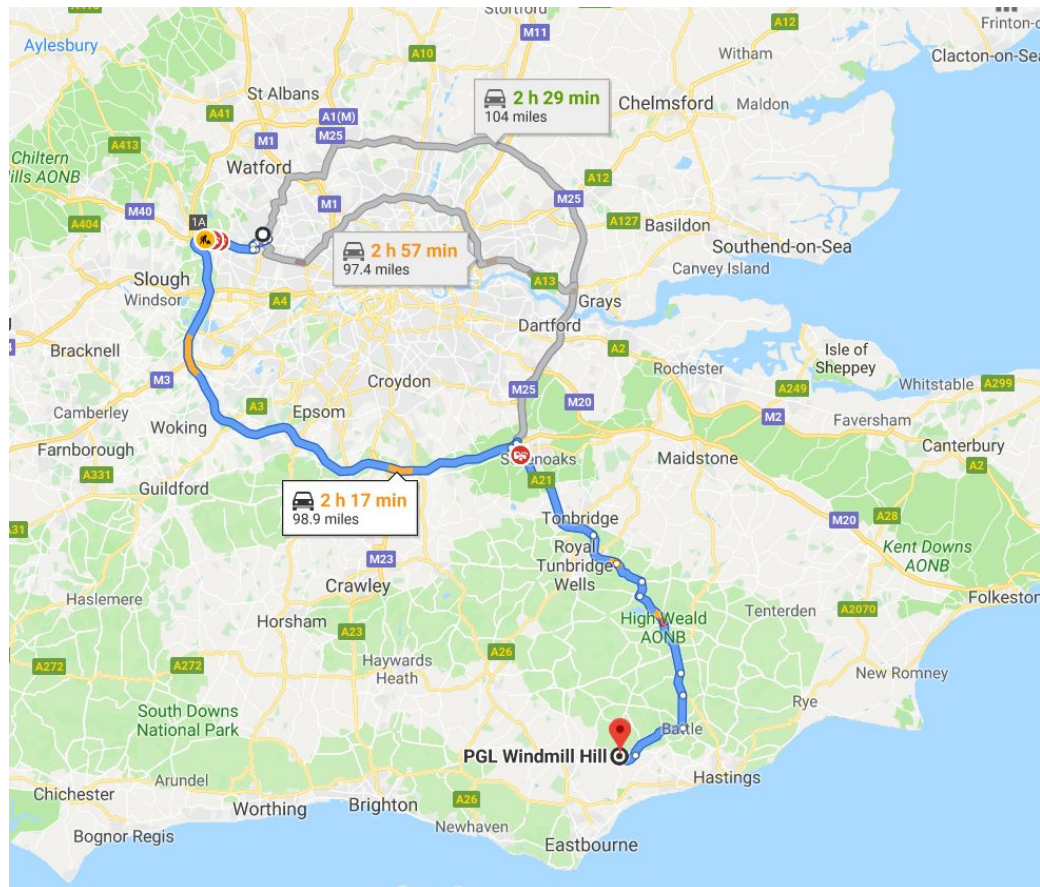
