Year Group Update

Nursery Update

This week we were excited to welcome two new pupils to our Nursery and we look forward to meeting one more next week. We helped them by showing them all the different areas of learning in the classroom.

In Literacy, we are busy retelling our focus story using a story map. This supports their confidence with storytelling and develops their language skills. Our story also involves a song which they're enjoying singing and acting out. Pupils have also been involved in various mark making activities using chalks, crayons and pencils.

Our topic continues to be on transport and we have been learning to name different kinds of vehicles and what they're used for. We have also learned about traffic lights and have played traffic light games. Pupils had so much fun creating their own traffic lights.

In Maths we have continued to estimate and count accurately to 3. We have used counting objects and actions to practise accurate counting.

Pupils are enjoying rolling snacks which are available throughout the day.





Reception Update

Reception has had a fantastic week! We have continued with our writing story 'The Three Little Pigs' and have really enjoyed retelling the story using story maps and writing our favourite parts. In writing next week we will be starting our new story of 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears'.

In Maths this week we have been learning and practising subtraction within 10 with the help of number lines and ten frames. <u>Here</u> is a game that you can play at home to practise subtraction.

In science this half term we are learning all about different materials and what these different materials can be used for. We have been exploring all of these different materials in the classroom this week. In RE we have started learning about Buddhism and have really enjoyed listening to the story of how Buddhism started.

In this week's topic lessons we have continued to explore the past and present through looking at how kitchens were different in the past to how they are now.

Please ensure you are reading with your children daily and recording your comments in the orange Reading Records Book on a daily basis. Please have fun with the books. Talk about the pictures and 2 the story. Ask simple questions to gauge comprehension (in a fun way) and just enjoy the time with your children. It is a great way to settle children

before bed and spend a little time with them before they go to sleep at night. Please remember to return Library books every FRIDAY.

Y1 Update

Year 1 have continued to enjoy learning about Mr Gumpy's Motor car in **Writing**. This week, we read a diary entry from Mr Gumpy's diary and analysed the key features of a diary. Then, we used a box plan to help us plan and write our own. We know that the key features of a diary include dear diary, the date, time, connectives and past tense.

In **Maths**, we explored direction and movement. For example, we learnt what a whole turn, half turn and quarter turn was as well as discovering what clockwise and anti-clockwise means. Also, we have continued to look at time and, in particular, adding on an hour and half an hour. To add on an hour to a time, we know that the minute hand has to go clockwise the whole way around the clock and finish where it started. To add half an hour, we know that the minute hand has to go clockwise halfway around the clock.

In **History** we have been learning about the development of transport through time. We explored the first modes of transport on a timeline, in comparison to the transport that we use today.

In **Science** we are continuing the topic Amazing Animals and grouped animals depending on whether they were mammals, fish or birds. We know that mammals have fur/hair and give birth to babies. Fish have scales, fins and gills and lay eggs. Birds have beaks, wings and most birds can fly. They also lay eggs too!

Y2 Update

This week in Year 2 we have started your new Maths unit of Fractions. The children have been focusing on identifying the numerator and the denominator for half and quarter of a shape and a number. The children have been using part-whole models to help identify the fraction. In Writing this week the children independently wrote a formal letter to inform someone about Planet Earth. The children produced a fantastic letter, they were able to showcase their knowledge and understanding of Planet Earth and the different features that we include within a formal letter.

In Science this week we continued to develop our understanding of living, dead or never lived items in and around our school. In Geography the children identified the different seas and oceans that we have on Planet Earth. They also learnt what animals live in the oceans and why they live there.

Y3 Update

It was great to meet the parents face to face this week and discuss all the hard work your children have been doing since September.

In **Reading** this week, we have read a fact file about Ancient Egypt compiled from the BBC Bitesize website. The children answered retrieval and inference questions and we looked at the following vocabulary: **important, construction, invented, preserved, structure** and **inspired.** We discussed their meaning, what word class they belong to and we used the words in a sentence of our own. We also looked at synonyms and antonyms for some of the words.

In **Mathematics**, we have continued our unit on multiplication and division. This week we have been looking at the commutativity of multiplication calculations and how we can represent this using arrays.

In **Writing**, we have created our own setting description using what we have learnt last week. We looked at a model text to help us identify the features, completed a box plan to help us organise our thoughts and finally we used our box plan to write our setting description about an Ancient Egyptian pyramid.

In **Science**, we have continued with our topic for this term, which is **Light and Shadows**. The children learnt about how light travels and how it is possible for us to see things. They learnt that light travels in straight lines; when looking at a light source, the light travels straight into our eyes and when seeing an object, light travels to the object and then **reflects** into our eyes. Our key words were: **iris**, **pupil** and **reflect.**

In **History**, we started our new topic, **Ancient Egypt** and in our first lesson we learnt about when and where Ancient Egypt was. The children learnt that Ancient Egypt was a civilisation in north-east Africa, it began about 5000 years ago and lasted for around 3000 years and the main periods of Ancient Egyptian history are called the Old Kingdom, Middle Kingdom and New Kingdom. Our key word for this lesson was: **civilisation**.

Please continue to support your child by engaging with all of the online homework portals. They are required to achieve a minimum of **200 correct answers and points** on **TTRS** and **Mathletics** every week as well as complete a **quiz** on Accelerated Reader for their reading book once finished. Completing the weekly homework set has a direct impact on your child's learning at school.

Y4 Update

This week in Reading, Year 4 have been reading an extract from an online travel guide about the Amazon. They looked at the different activities that various types of travellers might be interested in, and practised using new vocabulary in sentences. E.g array, excursion, portrayed, realm, venturing and drastically. Pupils also practised skills in inference and retrieval.

In Writing, we wrote an informal letter to a child in the Amazon rainforest about our life here in Roxbourne, including grammar features such as subordinating conjunctions to extend sentences.

In Maths, we started our fraction unit. We looked at fraction bars and fraction number lines to find equivalent fractions. Children had the opportunity to explore and recognise different interpretations of fractions by using a variety of manipulatives.

In Geography, we have started our new topic on Amazon, this week we focused on the key physical features of South America. We discovered South America is a continent in the Southern Hemisphere and there are many different climate zones across South America.

Please continue to ensure children are reading for **at least 15 minutes each day.** Accelerated reader quizzes should be taken immediately after a book is completed, ideally every 2 weeks. It is also important that children are consistently accessing Times Tables Rockstars to ensure they recall their multiplication tables. Finally, please ensure that children are completing their Mathletics homework.

Thank you to all the parents/guardians that attended parents evening this week. It was great to see many faces and discuss all the incredible work we have been doing in Year 5.

In **Reading** this week, we have continued to read the novel 'King of the Cloud Forests' by Michael Murpurgo. We have read chapter 2 and have been introduced to six new vocabulary words: exhilarated, terrible, frighten, exhausted, reassure and encourage. These words can be found in the text, as we try to incorporate them in our own writing throughout the week.

During **Maths** this week, we learnt how to order and compare fractions. We can identify fractions with denominators that have the same multiples. We also know that if you multiply the numerator and denominator, then you can find an equivalent fraction. Additionally, we used diene blocks to identify tenths and hundredths

In **Writing** this week, we were able to box plan our persuasive informal letter. We used our research, persuasive techniques and grammar examples to help us complete the plan. Since completing the box plan, we are able to write our persuasive letter. We know using techniques such as: alliteration, rule of three and rhetorical questions, can help persuade our audience! We're excited to finish and hopefully persuade you enough to visit Thailand!

This week in **Geography**, we looked at the five regions in Asia! We know that Asia is made up of 49 different countries and some Asian countries have a population of over 1 billion people. Using the chromebooks, we were able to research different countries across Asialooking at their capital city and population!

In **PSHE** this week, we started a new unit 'Dreams and Goals'. We spoke about some of our dreams and goals and what we would like to be when we grow up. We understood that we would still need money to help me achieve our goals.

Y6 Update

In **Reading** this week, we have been reading the poem, **Dulce et Decorum est** by Wilfred Owen. The poem, published in 1920, displays the harsh reality of how brutal World War One was. We spent a lot of time breaking the poem down to build our understanding. Our

key vocabulary words were: Lame, Floundering, Ecstasy, Writhing, Obscene and Ardent. We also focused on developing our retrieval and inference skills.

In **Maths**, we have continued our topic on coordinates, where we have been focusing on **reflection** and **translation** of shapes. We have also been looking at adding and subtracting mixed numbers.

In **Writing,** we have completed our model write for our persuasive speeches based on the play, **Macbeth**, by William Shakespeare. We have been focusing on using colons, and semicolons in our writing this week. Next week, we will be writing our independent piece!

In **History,** we have continued our topic, **Conflict and Resolution** with a focus on World War One. This week, we looked specifically at the British Army and how Britain utilised their colonies to aid them with more soldiers. We also learned that **conscription** was introduced in 1916. This means that every unmarried man between the ages 18-41 was forced to sign up to the army. Britain later changed this rule to include married men too.

In **Science**, we have continued our topic, **Evolution and Inheritance**, where this week, we learned about **variation**. Variation means that different organisms within the same species have **traits and physical characteristics** that means they all appear to look different. Within our classes, we carried out investigations to test variation. We looked at how our height, shoes sizes, hair colour and eye colours are all different.

In **PSHE**, we have started our topic, **Dreams and Goals**, where this week, the children had the opportunity to share and discuss what they believe to be their strengths whilst also showing some aspiration by coming up with a goal within school and out of school too.

Nursery Universal Entitlement: Please note, in Nursery, all three and four year olds are entitled to 15 hours per week of early year's education each academic year from the start of the term after their third birthday - this is known as the *universal entitlement*.

Nursery 30 Hour Provision: Three and four year olds, whose parents meet a government criteria, are also eligible for an additional 15 hours per week at zero cost to the parent - this is known as the *extended entitlement*. If you are not eligible for 30 Hour Provision, but are still interested in this offer, please contact our admissions team - the current charge for the additional four hours per day is only £15.00 per day.
