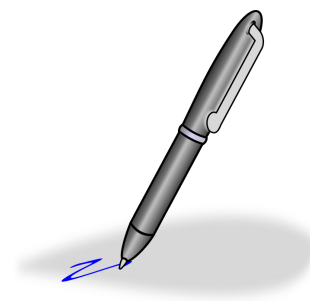
Cookery Club : Thursday 12th January 2023

Year Group Updates

Nursery Update

This week we were excited to welcome four new pupils to our Nursery and pupils were fascinated to see a set of identical twins:). We helped them by showing them all the different areas and activities in the classroom.

In maths we have been learning about 3D shapes and we made 3D rockets using recyclable material for our space display.

In Literacy children are developing their tripod grip and have been involved in various mark making activities using chalks, crayons and pencils. We have been roleplaying our focus story in our roleplay area as well as learning new vocabulary linked to the story.

In PE pupils are learning to move in different ways as well as learning to balance on the apparatus.

Our topic continues to be on transport and we have been learning to name different kinds of vehicles and what they're used for.



Reception Update

Reception has had a fantastic week! We have continued with our writing story 'The Three Little Pigs' and have really enjoyed learning the actions and sequence of the story.

In maths this week we have been learning and practicing our addition up to 10 with the help of number lines. [Here](#) is a game that you can play at home to practice addition.

In science this half term we are learning all about different materials and what these different materials can be used for. We have been exploring all of the different materials in the classroom this week. This half term we are learning about Buddhism in RE and have really enjoyed listening to the story of how Buddhism started.

Enrichment Trip - 25th January 2023

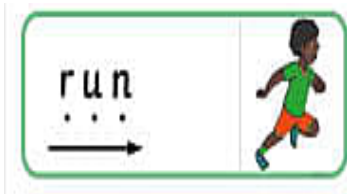

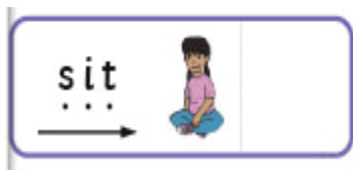

Y1 Update

Year 1 has had a great week, we have continued with our story 'Mr Gumpy's motor car'. This week we used a box plan to help us plan and write our own narratives. The focus has been on adjectives to make our stories more interesting. In Maths, we have been focusing on using various strategies such as; 'Make ten', 'Near doubles', 'Count on' and 'Known facts'. In Geography we learnt about how people travel safely around the local area. We also looked at how traffic lights work and other things that help us to travel safely e.g zebra crossing, footpaths and road signs.

For science this half term our topic is Amazing Animals. We have started our topic by investigating different types of animals. We know animals are living things. They eat, grow, breathe, reproduce, move, react and get rid of waste.

Finally, we would like to thank all parents and carers of Year 1 with their continued support and engagement so far, and in particular this week during our Parent consultations. It was wonderful to discuss and celebrate children's successes so far, but also to share strategies for further improvement.

Y2 Update

Thank you for all attending parents evening, it was great to meet you all face to face.

In Writing this week we have been focusing on our class text 'The Secret Sky Garden'. We have been using some super adjectives to describe the main character from our book. In preparation for next week please read/ watch the story of 'Little Red Riding Hood' and talk to your child about the main characters- appearance/personality.

In Maths we have been consolidating our knowledge of multiplication and division. It has been great to see how confident they have become with their rolling numbers. Please continue to practise their rolling numbers at home. Next week we will be focusing on time, in preparation for this please look at a clock with your child and talk through basic timings. Eg. What time do we wake up? When do you eat lunch?

We have continued our topics this week- In Geography we looked at different countries in Europe and their capital cities. We have looked at the five different oceans that we have on Planet Earth. In Science we have been identifying if things are not living, living and have never lived. The children have really enjoyed starting our new topics!

Please continue to support your child by listening to them read every day for at least 15 minutes and filling in their reading record with comments afterwards. Please also support your child in engaging and interacting with their homework. We are giving a new Maths book for your child to complete weekly. (5 pages per week- day 1-5)
Your child will have also received a reading comprehension activity that needs to be completed and returned back on Friday 27th January. Ensure that your child is practising their spellings every week in preparation for the spelling tests on Friday mornings.

Y3 Update

In Reading, we have started looking at an extract on Roman Baths. We deep delved into our key vocabulary words by looking at the definition, how it's used in the correct context, and thinking about synonyms and antonyms. After reading the extract, we answered some retrieval and inference questions to test our understanding and to think about the specific language that the author has chosen to use.

In Mathematics, we have continued with looking at our topic on length. We have looked at how to measure different objects in the classroom in centimetres, millimetres and in mixed units. We also came up with some of our own estimations beforehand to see how close we were when accurately measuring afterwards. We have now moved on to looking at how to find the perimeter of different 2-D shapes.

In Writing, we have started to write our persuasive letters after completing our box plans. Our persuasive letters are written to parents and carers to convince them that school dinners are better than packed lunches and to allow their children to have school dinners instead. Year 3 has enjoyed thinking about this point of view and there were lots of unique ideas which led to a fantastic debate.

In Science, we have continued to look at our topic on Lights and Shadows. We started writing about the different light sources that we found around the school and within our own classroom. We made sure that we used our key vocabulary (light source, natural and man-made) in our writing to explain the differences between the light sources and what light sources we didn't see and the reasons for this.

In Art, we have started our topic on Ancient Egypt. The children were very excited to learn some new facts about Ancient Egyptian art and they browsed through a variety of some famous pieces, including the Great Sphinx, Queen Nefertiti's bust, and Tutankhamun's gold mask. We looked at how these art pieces can be categorised into types of architecture, sculptures, or paintings. We then focused on one of the art pieces in more detail, The Book of Dead, and learnt about its importance in Ancient Egyptian religion.

In Geography, we have started our topic on Europe. We first looked at the different parts that Europe can be separated into: North, South, East, and West, and the different countries that are located in these areas. The children then really enjoyed using an atlas to find the different countries in Europe to annotate and colour in their own maps.

Please continue to support your child by listening to them read every day for at least 15 minutes and filling in their reading record with comments afterwards. When they complete a book, **they should also complete a quiz about the book on Accelerated Reader**. Please also support your child in engaging and interacting with Times Tables Rock Stars (TTRS) as

this will help them to improve their multiplication fluency. Ensure that your child is practising their spellings every week in preparation for the spelling tests on Friday mornings. Please find the information on homework on Google Classroom and support your child in completing those.

Y4 Update

This week in Reading, Year 4 have been reading an extract from an online travel guide about the Amazon. They looked at the different activities that various types of travellers might be interested in, and practised using new vocabulary in sentences. Pupils also practised skills in inference, retrieval and summary, choosing important details of the text to include.

In Writing, we have completed an advertisement for travelling to London. The children were able to use their advertisement toolkits and persuade visitors to come to this wonderful city. They included imperative verbs and rhetorical questions as grammar features, and chose different landmarks to write about.

In Maths, we have continued to learn about equivalent fractions. The children investigated the difference between fractions with the same denominator but different numerator, and fractions with the same numerator but different denominator. They then arranged different fractions on a number line. We have also started looking at improper fractions and their representations.

In Geography, we have continued our topic on the Amazon and South America. Children learned about the different countries of South America and their geographical location in the continent. In Science, we have started our new topic on Classification systems and Environments. Pupils were introduced to the key terms 'habitat', 'microhabitat', and 'ecosystem'.

Please continue to ensure children are reading for **at least 15 minutes each day**. Accelerated reader quizzes should be taken immediately after a book is completed, ideally every 2 weeks. It is also important that children are consistently accessing Times Tables Rockstars to ensure they recall their multiplication tables. Finally, please ensure that children are completing their Mathletics homework.

Y5 Update

This week, we have been reading an extract on Earthquakes, exploring how earthquakes occur and how these can cause tsunamis and avalanches in certain areas of the world. We read information about the San Francisco earthquake, Japan earthquake and Peru earthquake and answered some test-style questions about the text. In Writing, we took inspiration from Greta Thunberg and we have written persuasive speeches urging governments to do everything they can to stop climate change. In Mathematics we have begun our new unit, angles and we have begun drawing and measuring angles. Please can children continue to practise this at home. In Geography we have continued looking at Asia and its human geography, population in different countries as well as life expectancy. We researched different languages and religions for each country in Asia. In Science, we have been investigating the properties of materials and their importance, such as the materials used for waterproof jackets as well as houses and buildings.

Please can children continue to complete their weekly homework, including practising on TTRS, doing an AR quiz, completing their Mathletics tasks and filling in pages from their English CGP book. Children should also be reading and adding this to their Reading Records.

Y6 Update

In Reading, we have focused on an extract on president Barack Obama's victory speech in 2008. When reading, the children have focused on their delivery, through good tone and expression in their voices. We have also focused on retrieval and inference style questions. In Maths, we have focused on translating and reflecting 2D shapes on a grid.

In Writing, we have looked at some examples of persuasive speeches: Barack Obama (which we read in Reading!) and Sir Edward Grey, who delivered a speech to the nation informing Britain about the outbreak of World War 1. The children did a fantastic job practising and delivering part of both speeches in front of their classes.

In History, we have begun our topic, 'Conflict and Resolution'. We have focused on World War 1 and learned about the chain of events that led to the outbreak of war. We also studied a primary source which illustrated some key information about the power of each major nation going into war. In Science we have begun our topic, 'Evolution and Inheritance'. This week we have learned about the importance of fossils. We also learned about a woman named Mary Anning, whose fossil discoveries began to make people aware that species on Earth can become extinct.

In Art, we have focused on gothic and neoclassical architecture. Below you will find some examples of our iterations of the House of Parliament with a more modern focus!

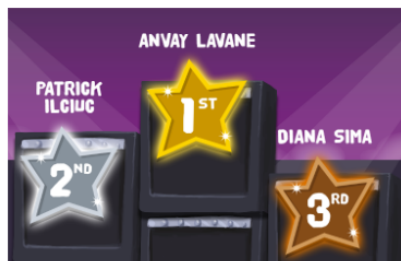

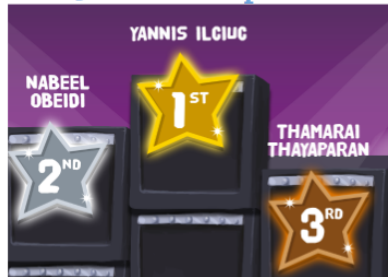

School admissions

Applications are now open for Nursery and Reception school places for September 2023. Due to high demand, places at Roxbourne Primary School fill very quickly. Nursery Admissions

Choosing the right nursery for your child can be difficult. **Roxbourne Nursery** provides high quality early years education, giving priority to the developmental needs and happiness of our children and their families in a safe environment where the wellbeing of every child is our utmost concern. Our teachers and support staff are passionate in their role of working with children and provide the necessary skills and knowledge to enhance the child's learning and development. As part of this process we recognise and value the diverse community that we are part of, believing that quality can be achieved by working together in partnership with parents and other service providers. We would love you to visit our beautiful homely environment to see how settled and happy the children are.



All three and four year olds are entitled to 15 hours per week of early year's education each academic year from the start of the term after their third birthday, up until the term after their fifth birthday. This is known as the *universal entitlement*.

Three and four year olds, whose parents meet the criteria, will be eligible for an additional 15 hours per week. This is known as the *extended entitlement*. Eligibility guidelines for free full-time nursery can be found at <https://www.gov.uk/30-hours-free-childcare>. If you are not eligible but would still be interested in a full-time place, please contact the school office on 020 8422 9207.

We offer three nursery sessions: morning only, afternoon only and full-time.
