There will be two booking options available on Arbor:


- Option 1: Non Uniform Day and Disco entry. Cost £2

Year Group Updates

Nursery Update

Nursery pupils were super excited and fascinated to see the field covered in white this week so we went out to explore. This was incidental learning! We discussed the changes in weather making footprints on the frosty grass and it felt crunchy. We also managed to find some ice on the ground and they were surprised to see how ice melted in their hands. We find that children get more out of it when we follow their interests.

In Maths we continue with 3D and 2D shapes, take your children out on shape hunt to find different shapes. Please continue to engage them in counting activities as well as looking at door numbers.

In Literacy this week we have been retelling the story 'Whatever Next' using a story map. Pupils are thoroughly enjoying this story and it's pleasing to see how stories are supporting their language development and imagination. Please continue to read stories at home. Encourage your child to talk about pictures, describe characters and make predictions.

As part of our topic on transport, In understanding the world and in art we have made astronauts. We talked about what astronauts look like, how they travel and what they do.

We are super excited to meet the firefighters who will be coming to visit Nursery pupils on the 31st January.



Reception Update

We have had another great week in Reception! We have started our new story in our writing lessons, 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears' and have really enjoyed creating actions for the different parts of the story.

In Maths this week we have been learning about subtraction within 10 with the help of number tracks and ten frames. Here is a game you can play at home to practice subtraction within 10.

So far in our topic this term we have been learning about how houses and communities have changed over time by looking at houses and settlements in the past and comparing them to those that we live in now. We have really enjoyed learning lots of new vocabulary that we can use in our busy learning.

Show and Tell



Y1 Update

In writing we have been focusing on 'Mr Gumpy's Motor Car' story. The children wrote their own narrative this week. For Maths, the children have been representing 2-digit numbers on a place value chart. In History, we have been investigating vehicles from the past and present as well as looking at travel conditions in the past. This week in Science our focus has been on grouping animals into different categories based on their characteristics. We looked at how scientists use special categories to group animals such as; Mammals, Birds, Fish, Amphibians and Reptiles. We discussed that animals in each category share special characteristics. For example, Mammals are warm blooded animals with fur or hair. They give birth to live young and feed their young with their milk.



Y2 Update

This week, Year 2 have been reading analogue time. More specifically, o'clock, quarter past, half past and quarter to the hour. You should have received an email with a link for some online resources which can support this learning.

We have also been Writing our character descriptions on the Big Bad Wolf from Red Riding Hood which has involved using adjectives to describe the appearance, personality and surroundings of the wolf. We have also begun to incorporate figurative language with simple similes.

In Science we have been learning about habitats and identifying features of our own habitat around the school.

In Geography, we have gathered information on Europe, North and South America which has included the climate, countries included and capital cities.

In Reading, most Year 2 pupils have been progressing in their phonics lessons. Other children have been taking part in whole class reading and have been answering comprehension questions on some reading extracts.

Y3 Update

This week in Reading, Year 3 read an information text about blue whales. We learnt a lot of new vocabulary and continued to practise our retrieval and inference skills as well as summarising. The new words learnt this week were **endangered**, **mammal**, **sift**, **organism**, **migrate and solitary**. Ask your child what these words mean and how they would use them in a sentence. In Writing, the children completed their independent task of writing a persuasive letter to Mr. Benserghin. They

are trying to convince him that a trip to either 'The Making of Harry Potter', 'Shrek's Adventures', or the IFS Cloud Cable Car would be an educational visit worth considering.

In Maths, we have continued to look at perimeters of 2D shapes and the children have been working on explaining how to calculate perimeters with mixed units of measure.

In Geography, we have continued learning about Europe and this week particularly we looked at physical features such as the River Volga in Russia, The River Danube, which flows through many European countries. We also looked at the Norwegian Fjords, the Bialowieza Forest, the beautiful beaches in the Algarve in Portugal with its limestone cliffs and the Plitvice Lakes National Park in Croatia.

In Science, we continue to look at light and this week we have been focusing on why we have day and night and how that occurs. We have also discussed how it is possible for us to see the Moon as it is not a source of light.

As always, please continue to support your child with their homework. They should access TTRS every day and complete 3 Mathletics activities. In addition, they should be reading every day for a minimum of 15 minutes and completing a quiz every 1 to 2 weeks on Accelerated Reader as soon as they finish their book.

Y4 Update

This week in Reading, Year 4 practised skills in new vocabulary, retrieval and inference using the text 'Top 15 Amazon Rainforest Activities'. The new words learned this week were: array, supplemented, portray, realm, exhilarating and excursion - as the children what each word means and how they might use them in a sentence! In Writing, the children completed their independent writing task of an advertisement, encouraging tourists to visit the Amazon Rainforest. They were mindful to use imperative verbs, rhetorical questions and noun phrases in their writing as persuasive features.

In Maths, we have continued with the fractions topic. Pupils learned to add and subtract fractions below one, representing the equations using bar models.

In Geography this week, the children learned about trade in South America and charted the exports of each country. They also learned about the dominant languages and religions of the continent. In Science, we introduced the concept of food webs and food chains, learning new subject specific vocabulary: producer, consumer, prey and predator.

Enrichment trip to Thames Explorer Trust: Tuesday 24th January 2023

We are very excited for the opportunity to take the children to a workshop at Thames Explorer Trust. We have sent home a checklist of items to bring on the day, please ensure this is checked before the trip as children will need all items to be able to participate safely and comfortably in the workshop.

Homework:

Please continue to encourage children to access TTRS and Mathletics, completing the set exercises. It is also important that pupils are reading for at least 15 minutes each day. Once they have completed their books, they can test their knowledge through an Accelerated Reader quiz.

Y5 Update

This week Year 5 have been focusing on an extract from a story named Chinese Cinderella. We read about the author's life and how this impacted her writing. We discussed vocabulary from the text and debated on whether or not we agreed with the stepmother's decisions. In Writing, we wrote persuasive speeches about deforestation and habitat loss before publishing this into our extended writing books. In Maths, children have finished their topic of angles and consolidated their learning by looking at example SATs questions where they needed to calculate and measure angles. In Science, we conducted an experiment on insulation by measuring the temperature of water in different containers. We used thermometers and timers. In Geography, we learnt about the different types of borders between countries and why these boundaries were created in the first place.

Please can children continue to recap these skills on TTRS and Mathletics as well as completing quizzes on Accelerated Reader. We will be informing children of their new reading levels next week so they can choose books from the library. Children should also be completing pages from their CGP English books.

<u>Trip:</u> On Thursday 2nd February, we have an exciting trip planned to China Town in Central London to visit and eat lunch at a Chinese restaurant. Children will be learning about Chinese New Year, as linked to our Asia topic, as well as travelling to China Town to explore the area. We look forward to our visit!

Y6 Update

This week in Reading, we have focused on an extract from the novel, War Horse by Michael Morpurgo. We have been introduced to different war themed types of vocabulary, as well as focusing on retrieval and inference questions. In Maths, we have looked at 3D shapes and their nets, as well as studying the different parts of a circle - **radius, diameter and circumference.**

In Writing, we have written, published and performed our own persuasive speeches, focusing on the outbreak of World War One. The children have done a fantastic job working on their tone and expression in their voices, and demonstrated great confidence when performing them in front of the whole year group.



In History, we have continued our topic, Conflict and Resolution, this week focusing on how Britain's army was made up of many soldiers across the British Empire, from countries such as India, New Zealand, Canada and more! In Science, we have continued our topic, Evolution and Inheritance, this week focusing on how certain animals and plants, such as polar bears and cacti have been able to adapt to survive in their environments.

In Computing we have been focusing on 3D modelling. Below you can see the children all interacting and showing their creativity when using and modelling 3D shapes.



School admissions

Applications are now open for Nursery and Reception school places for September 2023. Due to high demand, places at Roxbourne Primary School fill very quickly. Should you have family, friends or neighbours with Nursery or Reception aged children, please let them know that applications are now open as detailed below.

Open Days

We are running a series of Open mornings to allow prospective parents to visit the school during a teaching day, meet with our Head Teacher Mr Benserghin and ask any questions they may have. If any of your family, friends or neighbours, who are interested in applying to Roxbourne for a place for their child, would like to attend one of our Open Mornings, please ask them to register on our Open Morning booking <u>form</u>.

Nursery Admissions

Choosing the right nursery for your child can be difficult. **Roxbourne Nursery** provides high quality early years education, giving priority to the developmental needs and happiness of our children and their families in a safe environment where the wellbeing of every child is our utmost concern. Our teachers and support staff are passionate in their role of working with children and provide the necessary skills and knowledge to enhance the child's learning and development. As part of this process we recognise and value the diverse community that we are part of, believing that quality can be achieved by working together in partnership with parents and other service providers. We would love you to visit our beautiful homely environment to see how settled and happy the children are.



All three and four year olds are entitled to 15 hours per week of early year's education each academic year from the start of the term after their third birthday, up until the term after their fifth birthday. This is known as the *universal entitlement*.

Three and four year olds, whose parents meet the criteria, will be eligible for an additional 15 hours per week. This is known as the *extended entitlement*. Eligibility guidelines for free full-time nursery can be found at <u>https://www.gov.uk/30-hours-free-childcare</u>. If you are not eligible but would still be interested in a full-time place, please contact the school office on 020 8422 9207.

We offer three nursery sessions: morning only, afternoon only and full-time.
